## **Artist Bios**

**CAROL NOLTE/DANCE COLLECTIVE (Co-Producer)** has created over 50 dances for her award-winning company Dance Collective. She has received choreographic fellowships and awards from the New Jersey State Council on The Arts, The Djerassi Foundation, The Kalani Honua Institute, The Puffin Foundation, The Wurlitzer Foundation, The Yellow Springs Fellowship for the Arts, The Field Independent Artists Challenge Program and White Oak Plantation. Recently, her work has been seen at Merce Cunningham Studio, The Kitchen, Joyce SoHo, The 92nd Street Y Fridays at Noon. She has also co-founded and produced three dance festivals, DanceBLITZ, Taos Dance 2000, and, currently, WestFest.

**KIRSTIN KAPUSTIK (Co-Producer)** likes to make dances. She is a choreographer, dancer, curator, producer and teacher and received an M.F.A. in dance from Florida State University in 2009. Kirstin's dance works have been shown at Dixon Place, at The Citigroup Theater at the Ailvin Ailey Studios, Danspace at St. Mark's Church, and the Ringling International Arts Festival in Sarasota, Florida among others. Her choreography is most influenced by her work with Lynda Davis, Dan Wagoner, Jawole Willa Jo Zollar and summers at American Dance Festival. Kirstin currently works as the Event and Studio Manager at Center for Performance Research in Brooklyn, NY where she began a presenting series.

**GINA GIBNEY (Guest Artist)** has created a repertory of dance works that have been presented and commissioned by prestigious venues in the US and abroad. Described as a "poet of modern dance" by the New York Times, Gibney is also dedicated to bringing the power of dance – both in performance and in practice – where it would not otherwise exist. She is the founder of Gibney Dance Center, a seven-studio facility at 890 Broadway that serves the dance field with classes, space and unique programming. www.gibneydance.org

JAWOLE WILLA JO ZOLLAR, FOUNDING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, URBAN BUSH WOMEN (Guest Artist) Born and raised in Kansas City, Missouri, Jawole trained with Joseph Stevenson, a student of the legendary Katherine Dunham. After earning her B.A. in dance from the University of Missouri at Kansas City, she moved to New York City in 1980 to study with Dianne McIntyre at Sounds in Motion. She founded Urban Bush Women (UBW) in 1984 as a performance ensemble dedicated to exploring the use of cultural expression as a catalyst for social change. In addition to 34 works created for the company, Jawole's work is in the repertory of Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater / Philadanco / Dayton Contemporary Dance Company / Ballet Arizona / University of Maryland / Virginia Commonwealth University / Towson University and others. A Guggenheim fellow, she received her M.F.A in dance from Florida State University and is the Nancy Smith Fichter Professor of Dance and Robert O. Lawton Distinguished Professor at FSU.

**TAKEHIRO "Take" UEYAMA (Guest Artist)** was born and raised in Tokyo, Japan and moved to the United States in 1991 to study at the Juilliard School in New York. After after eight years with the Paul Taylor Dance Company, Takehiro Ueyama founded **TAKE Dance**. TAKE Dance has performed at venues across the country including, Jacob's Pillow, Dance Theater Workshop, PS/21 in Chatham, University at Albany, SaratogaArtsFest, The Lewis Center at Princeton University, in Italy at the 29<sup>th</sup> Internationale Dance Festival in Cagliari, Sardinia and at San Francisco's Cowell Theater. **THE BANG GROUP's (Guest Artist)** *Nut/Cracked* is in its ninth consecutive season having received its premiere in Genoa, Italy in November 2003. It will be presented at New York Live Arts December 21-23, 2011. The Bang Group continues to tour and perform David Parker's choreographic reimagining of *Annie Get Your Gun*, called *ShowDown*, and will perform *Misters and Sisters*, a song-and-dance love story for two men, at Oberon in Cambridge, MA in January.

**DIANE CAHILL BEDFORD** serves as Professor of Dance at San Jacinto College in Houston, TX where she teaches all levels of Modern, Ballet, Jazz, and Dance Appreciation. She holds an M.F.A. in Dance Performance and Choreography (2010) and her B.F.A in Dance (2003) from Florida State University. Diane has performed with Jana Hicks Repertory in NYC, Dance Repertory Theatre, and The Tallahassee Ballet. She has also been fortunate to perform the repertory of Jawole Zollar, Gerri Houlihan, Terry Creach, and Lynda Davis. In 2008, Diane was selected to perform a reconstruction of Hanya Holm's *Jocose* at The American Dance Festival. Her choreography has been presented by the Dance Gathering in Houston, Brazos Dance Collective, Fort Wayne Ballet, The Tallahassee Ballet, and The FSU Opera. This past spring, her work *White Lies* was adjudicated at the American College Dance Festival in Las Cruces, NM. Diane has

previously taught dance and directed outreach programming for FSU, Charleston Ballet Theatre, Fort Wayne Ballet, New England Ballet Theatre, and Ithaca Ballet.

**Theodora Boguszewski** is a native of Berkeley, California. She attended the Conservatory of Dance at SUNY Purchase from 2006-2010, graduating with a BFA in Dance, a concentration in composition, and a minor in art history. In the second semester of her senior year, Theo founded The Hoover Dam Collective, a young artist's collective dedicated to making interdisciplinary work and putting on collaborative shows. Since it's founding, the Hoover Dam Collective has taken off, doing shows throughout Brooklyn and Manhattan, in Nyack, and at the Desiderata Music Festival. Theo's work has been shown at the Solar One Festival, the Dumbo Dance Festival, The Cool NY Festival, Sunday Brunch at the Rover, The Fridays at Noon Series, and at many Hoover Dam Collective shows. Theo currently dances with Road Work Dance and Vital Dance Company, and continues to create her own work.

**EVE CHAN** performed as a ballerina with the Hong Kong Ballet for nine years. During that period, she toured with the company throughout Europe, America, Canada, and China and worked with numerous well-known artists and choreographers including Krzystof Pastor, Nils Christe, Rudi van Danzig, Wayne Eagling, and Ronald Hynd. Chan's choreographic career began with the Company's choreography workshops in 2002. In 2007, she was appointed as one of three resident choreographers by Mr. John Meehan who was the Artistic Director at the time. In that same year, she was commissioned to do a new contemporary work, *Night Light*, for the company's main season. In 2008, she was commissioned to create a contemporary duet, *butterfly lovers*, for two principal dancers to perform at the 2008 Gala Internacional de Estrellas in Chile. The ballet was also recently performed at the 2011 Auf der Weltspitze International Ballet Gala in Germany. In 2009, Chan was invited to represent Hong Kong and **choreograph a short piece for 60th anniversary of china, which was held in Beijing.** Currently, Chan receives a full scholarship from the Hong Kong Jockey Club for her MFA studies at Purchase College, where she teaches pointe class in the Conservatory of Dance and ballet technique classes for non-majors through the School of the Arts.

**ALEXIS CONVENTO**, from Philadelphia, PA, is a freelance choreographer and dance artist who received a BFA in Dance from the Ailey/Fordham program in 2008. She has had the pleasure to perform alongside individual talents and companies, some including: Helen Pickett, Vanessa Walters, Adam Hougland, Corey Hayes, and Mylène Farmer (FRANCE). Alexis has the privilege to present her own work at numerous festivals and showcases including: newsteps/Chen Dance Center, the HATCH Presenting Series, The Current Sessions, Your Move (NJ), Peridance Capezio Center, and Hoover Dam Collective, among others.
