Artist Talk: Avri Ohana and Masha Neverova

Wednesday July 9, 7-8 pm,

In their Artist Talk, Avri Ohana and Masha Neverova, will be discussing their artistic journey, including the main influences that inspired their art, as well as their current work as represented in their respective shows: Ohana's, Nature Within, and Neverova's, Foothold.

Avri Ohana was born in Morocco and immigrated to Israel at the age of 12. As a young man, he lived in Ein Hod, Israel's first artist village, where he was influenced by the European Dadaist Marcel Janco, and the painter Eric Brauer of the Vienna School of Fantastic Realism. Ohana's exhibitions, ranging stylistically from the semi figurative to the phantasmagoric, and the abstract, include solo and group shows in Israel, Europe, and the United States, where he has been living for many years.

Masha Neverova was born in Leningrad USSR and is presently living in New York. As a child, she was highly influenced by her father who is a visual artist. . She studied at The School of Contemporary Art 'Free Workshops' at the Moscow Museum of Modern Art. Neverova is working with themes related to ritual, trauma, myth, and memory. Her visual language uses technology, painting, graphics, embroidery, objects, clay, and performance. Neverova participated in solo and group exhibitions in Israel, Georgia, Lithuania, and Russia.
